OUR STORY

- Governed by the Broward County Board of County Commissioners
- Nearly 100 years old, Port Everglades welcomed its first commercial ship in 1928 after the “wedding of the waters” on February 22, 1928.
- Located in the center of the 8th largest metropolitan area in the U.S. with approximately 87 million combined seasonal and permanent consumers within a one-day drive.
- Port Everglades’ Foreign-Trade Zone (FTZ No. 25) includes all of Broward County with 10 sites, eight users and two operators.
- Art-In-Public-Places is a core feature throughout the port, with installations like the mural on the Harbormaster tower and “Cruising School” in Cruise Terminal 18.

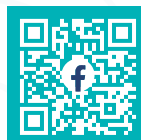
